


You'll also have built great connections with academic staff and mentors making your study and teaching experience that extra bit special.

WHAT SHOULD I STUDY?

Taught courses involve lectures and seminars followed by a dissertation or project. Courses are available full-time, part-time or through distance learning.

Research degrees means that you get to study an area in-depth, report your findings and be assessed through oral examination. You can study research degrees full or part-time.

HOW SHOULD I STUDY?

Full-time study

Choose to study full-time and normally you'll qualify in just a year. Whether you continue straight from your undergraduate course or you're return to learning, we will support you.

Part-time study

Around half our students study part-time and spread their studies over a few years. Our realistic approach to learning means most courses have part-time options. Manage your workload around existing commitments, work or family life.

Distance learning

Join our many students studying online. Our digital teaching includes online seminars, live lectures, green screen presentations and discussion boards. Impressive e-learning facilities mean you can access information when it suits you.

OUR RESEARCH

At the University of South Wales we provide solutions to problems that affect society and the economy is what underpins research at USW. We focus on your success not ours. Our reputation is made by the impact of our graduates, research and partnerships. They work to change our world and lives for the better.



MASTERS BY RESEARCH (MA OR MSc)

You will submit and defend via oral examination, a thesis demonstrating critical investigation and analysis of a topic. Full-time study will take one year, and part-time will take two years. Your submitted thesis will be up to 40,000 words.

MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY

You will submit and defend via oral examination, a thesis demonstrating critical investigation and analysis of a topic. Full-time study will take up to two years, and part-time three years. Your submitted thesis will be up to 60,000 words

DOCTOR OF COUNSELLING **PSYCHOLOGY (DPsych)**

This Professional Doctorate is accredited by the British Psychological Society (BPS) and approved by the HCPC. Students complete 450 supervised clinical hours and are taught modules at Masters and Doctoral level. You will submit a thesis up to 50,000 words and defend your work orally.

DOCTOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (DBA)

This Professional Doctorate takes three to four years full-time and five to six years part-time. You will complete taught elements at advanced level and supervised, independent research. You will demonstrate an original contribution and submit a thesis of up to 100,000 words, and defend your work orally.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (PhD)

PhD by Thesis: The most popular route to the award of PhD. You will initially register for an MPhil/PhD. You will submit for examination and defend a thesis which must make an original contribution to knowledge. You can register directly for a PhD if you have a Masters degree with a substantial research element. It normally takes around three to four years full-time and up to five years part-time. Your submitted thesis will be up to 100,000 words.

PhD by Portfolio: You will submit for examination and defend an approved portfolio of up to three projects, together with a critical overview. They should show an independent and original contribution to knowledge equivalent to a PhD thesis. It takes between one and five years to complete part-time.

PhD by Publication: If you have an approved body of published work, and have strong links with USW or are a past or present member of staff or alumnus, you may be eligible to apply. You will submit for examination and defend your published work, together with a critical overview. Your work should demonstrate significant authorship and originality. It takes between one and two years to complete part-time.

GRADUATE SCHOOL

The Graduate School is home to postgraduate research programmes and first point of contact if you are interested in a research degree.



POSTGRADUATE COMMUNITY

Research students will be registered and supervised by expert academics in their faculty. The Graduate School provides many comprehensive development opportunities, which bring researchers from different disciplines together into one community.

A FLEXIBLE SPACE

The Graduate School's flexible space is designed with postgraduate research study in mind. It includes spaces for self-study, supervision and group meetings, workshops and seminars, and networking events.

SUPER BUGS IN SEWAGE HELP CONVERT STEELMAKING EMISSIONS INTO SUSTAINABLE RAW MATERIALS FOR OTHER INDUSTRIES Billions of microscopic bacteria are helping scientists convert emissions from Tata Steel's blast furnaces into products which could be used by other industries to make products such as food packaging to animal feed. A pilot project, led by the University of South Wales (USW), has been set up at the two huge Port Talbot ironmaking furnaces. While still in its infancy, the project has already shown promising results.



USW LEGAL ADVICE CLINIC PARTNERSHIP HELPS PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

A project helping provide free legal advice to people experiencing homelessness in Cardiff has won a national award in recognition of its impact on the community.

Cardiff Lawyers Care – a partnership between USW Legal Advice Clinic, Cardiff & District Law Society and homelessness charity The Wallich, was named the winner of the LawWorks Cymru Award, which recognises pro bono work in Wales.

TEACHING AND EDUCATION FACILITIES

At USW Newport, you will learn in an environment that fully prepares you for the world of work. There are spaces that recreate different learning spaces including classrooms, science laboratories and flexible learning spaces as well as technological resources including augmented and virtual reality. The University is an accredited Apple Regional Training Centre.

learning and teaching environment and is used to conduct immersive, simulated scenarios for a variety of students from our Police Sciences, Nursing and Social Work to Public Health, Business and Marketing courses. Hydra is a training tool that enables the monitoring of group dynamics, real-time leadership and naturalistic decision making in critical incidents. Scenarios are immersive and often replicate real-life conditions, allowing students to deal with real-life situations in a safe learning environment.

CRIME SCENE LABORATORIES AND TRAINING FACILITIES

Our crime scene laboratories are used by forensic science and professional policing students to learn more about particular types of evidence such as fingerprints, footwear marks, tyre treads and blood spatter patterns. Our crime scene investigation house contains a number of realistic crime scene simulations - from domestic burglaries and break-ins, to more complex scenes such as homicides and fatal fires.

CLINICAL SIMULATION CENTRE

Our Clinical Simulation Centre replicates clinical environments for education and training. These include two, four-bedded bays to simulate a hospital setting, dedicated paediatric and maternity facilities, including a special care baby unit, an intensive care environment and an emergency department with a fully equipped ambulance simulator.

Get hands-on in our multi-million-pound USW Sport Park, where you'll use the same facilities, tools and techniques that attract elite athletes ensuring all students are professionally

CARDIFF CAPITAL REGION GRADUATE SCHEME






USW's Cardiff campus is in the creative centre of the capital.

It's bidding to become the UK City of Culture 2025, which would be a year-long celebration of Newport's diversity and communities that are rich in culture, tradition and language.


Our modern campus is on the riverfront, home to a community of learning that's dedicated to improving people's lives.

FEES AND FUNDING

Postgraduate study may be more affordable than you first thought. There's a number of ways to fund your postgraduate study, and this can be through student finance, bursaries, grants, trusts and charities or a combination of each option.

TUTION FEES

Postgraduate tuition fees, including part-time fees, vary depending on what, how and where you study. For the latest information visit our course pages.

POSTGRADUATE FUNDING

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

You may be entitled to money to fund your study and living costs, that does not have to be paid back. How much a student receives, how it is paid and who can receive it will vary depending on the scholarship or bursary, but the money doesn't usually have to be paid back (unless you decide to leave the course early).

CHARITIES, TRUSTS AND FOUNDATIONS

You may be eligible for financial support from external Grants, Trusts or Charities or through other funding. You may also be eligible for extra funding if you are an unpaid carer. 


