Summer schools/Short courses

The Centre for International English offers a range of short courses that usually run during the summer and range from one to eight weeks in length. Pre-sessional Programme

The Pre-sessional Programme is for academically qualified students who need to improve their general and academic English language skills before starting a foundation, undergraduate or postgraduate degree course at the University of South Wales. To enrol on the Pre-sessional English course, you must have a valid offer from the University of South Wales and an appropriate IELTS score (please see table below).

The Pre-sessional programme is designed to:

- Improve English language proficiency in the core skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing at the level required to undertake a university qualification.
- Provide study skills guidance, including giving presentations, taking notes from lectures, writing assignments and exam technique.
- Offer advice on how to gain the best from the online and offline study materials available to you from multiple sources. Assessment will be by means of coursework, tests, projects, individual and group presentations, and online assignments.

In-sessional Programme

Some international students may need to maintain their academic English language level throughout their degree programme. The In-sessional Programme is a programme of free classes aimed at helping students with academic reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. These classes take place in the autumn and spring terms only. You should register your interest with the Centre for International English at the beginning of term.

International Foundation Programme (IFP)

Our International Foundation Programme (IFP) is an access course for international students who are interested in pursuing an undergraduate degree in the UK. It prepares students for direct entry to the first year of an undergraduate degree at the University of South Wales, by offering the opportunity to improve their English language ability and to study a range of subjects to the standard required for progression to undergraduate study. Students will also become familiar with UK university life, its academic requirements, and unique teaching and learning approaches. Learners will be taught in small groups and assessment will be by means of coursework, tests, projects, individual and group presentations, and online assessments. There are two IFP courses at the University of South Wales and students will be placed on the appropriate course depending on their English language level.

Course Content:

- Speaking and listening skills, academic reading, academic writing and study skills (the selection of English modules taken will depend on language background and English level).
 Subject modules in Business, Law and Sociology (for the general pathway) or Engineering (for the Engineering pathway).
- Key skills: Maths and Computing.

We offer two pathways, specifically designed to fit the needs of our University of South Wales degree programmes.

General pathway

Upon successful completion of the IFP and fulfilment of the academic and English language progression criteria, students can progress to an undergraduate award at the University in one of the following subject areas: • Business

- Law, Accounting and Finance
- Humanities and Social Sciences (excluding Creative Writing and English)
- Psychology
- Computing

Engineering pathway

Upon successful completion of the IFP and fulfilment of the academic and English language progression criteria, students can progress to the first year of an undergraduate award at the University in the following areas: Engineering:

- BEng/BSc (Hons) Civil Engineering
- BSc (Hons) Mathematical Science (if student has equivalent of grade B at A-level in Maths)
- BEng (Hons) Aeronautical

- Electrical and Lighting Technology:
- BSc (Hons) Electrical and Electronic Engineering
- BEng (Hons) Electromechanical Systems Design
- BEng (Hons) Electrical and Electronic Engineering

- BEng (Hons) Computer Systems Engineering

They enable entrance to university or college, and improve job prospects by benchmarking and certifying progress in English. More than 11,000 employers, universities and government bodies around the world recognise Cambridge English Language Assessment qualifications. The Centre for International English offers the following examinations:

- Preliminary English Test (PET) A2 level
- First Certificate in English (FCE) B2 level
- Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) C1 level
- Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE) C2 level

We are also accredited to provide the Cambridge Business English Certificate (BEC) examinations.

Profile of recommended examinations for university entry:

First Certificate in English (FCE)

This is the Cambridge ESOL upper intermediate exam. It tests your ability to communicate with confidence in written and spoken English in a variety of everyday situations. It is an ideal exam for those who want to use English for work or study purposes. Successful completion certifies English language competence at B2 level (equating to IELTS 5.5 to 6.5). Most UK universities require students to have a minimum of B2 for undergraduate study.

Certificate in Advanced English (CAE)

This is the level of English required for more demanding academic or professional settings. It shows that you are highly proficient in English and that you are well-placed to deal with complicated academic and professional tasks in English. Successful completion certifies English language competence at C1 level (equating to IELTS 7.0 to 8.0). Students with this certificate will usually have no problems pursuing postgraduate study or research at a UK university.

The Centre for International English also runs Cambridge English Language Assessment exam preparation courses throughout the year. Please contact us for more information.

Language Training for Professionals

The Centre for International English provides a range of language and educational training courses for individuals, organisations and educational institutions. Our teaching team can come to your place of work, or arrange a bespoke training programme here at the University. In many cases accommodation can be arranged and on longer programmes, delegates will be taken on field trips to local places of interest. We think it is important to include a wider audience in your professional training, so we will also arrange guest lectures, tutorials and visits relevant to your subject area.


English for Aviation

Technical English

We can provide a highly skilled team of language specialists who can produce and assist in the generation of technical documentation capable of meeting the requirements of the ASD STE-100 (Aerospace and Defence Industries Association of Europe Simplified Technical English). Reference and adherence to this technical glossary and writing guide is essential for anyone working in the aviation industry, particularly in the areas of aircraft manufacturing and maintenance. Our teaching team will work effectively, efficiently and professionally with your organisation; our aim is to assist both native and nonnative speakers of English to achieve a level of familiarity and fluency with this specific field of technical English language.

ICAO Proficiency

Since 2008, aviation professionals such as ground staff, air traffic controllers and pilots have been required to fulfil the English language requirements prescribed by the ICAO and be re-assessed at appropriate intervals. The ICAO Language Proficiency assessment represents the range of language often used for oral and aural communication in civil aviation. The team of language experts at the University of South Wales offers targeted English language classes, using contemporary teaching techniques and carefully selected materials to help delegates reach the level of proficiency stipulated by their particular role in the aviation industry. For instance, Level 4 (Operational) is the minimum level required for those working in Radio-Telephony and for pilots working on international routes.

Academic Professional Development

The Centre for International English provides bespoke professional practice programmes for academics from all over the world. During these programmes, which range from four to twelve weeks in length, you and your colleagues will develop cutting-edge teaching techniques as you explore your academic disciplines and further your research interests. The programme can be run at the University of South Wales or on your university campus. As internationalisation becomes more significant in higher education, learning and teaching through the medium of English is at the forefront of many institutions' agendas. The University of South Wales's unique Professional Development Programmes will help enhance the standard of your academic staff and the reputation of your university. Recent programmes include:

Developing English Language Medium Teaching for Higher Education

This programme is intended for academics who need to teach bilingually or through the medium of English when they return to their country. It helps participants develop advanced communication skills, such as delivery of professional presentations and writing research papers for publication. By the end of the course, participants will have produced a portfolio of teaching materials, which can then be used at their institution to enhance teaching and learning for students and staff.

Directors Training Programme

This educational leadership programme covers a range of educational, management and cultural topics, and is useful for those involved in quality assurance, administration or management at a higher education institution overseas. This programme typically lasts three weeks, with the last few days spent on a sightseeing tour of the UK. Sessions are delivered in English and a translator can be provided if required.

Research-Based Programme in English Language and Linguistics

This programme is aimed at experienced non-native teachers of English. It enables participants to observe lessons in a range of relevant subjects and engage in scholarly activity, with the aim of enhancing their theoretical knowledge and teaching technique. Delegates also attend sessions on teaching methodology and research issues in ELT.

Medical Teacher Training

This programme helps gualified doctors and nurses develop their teaching skills in order for them to oversee the training of international medics. Part of the programme is dedicated to improving general and medical English language skills and guest lectures are provided by experts in the field. Typical lectures include public health, pain management and genetics. However, themes are adapted to suit a particular cohort. The programme also provides opportunities to visit local hospitals and observe lessons in medical sciences.

Bespoke Professional Development Courses

We also run bespoke development programmes for English language teachers from around the world. Recent examples include a First Certificate in English (FCE) teaching/testing workshop for a Dutch college and a four-week English language teaching skills programme for Mexican state school teachers.

Participants on our professional development programmes will be granted full staff access to electronic and library resources.
